As artists, we feel it is important to portray the characters on stage in a way that it pinches through the heart of the viewer, and that requires contemplation of story, understanding of characters perspective and intense practice. Going back into the timeline, we trace the days when we were naive performers, new to a world that felt liberating enough to stay. At college, while working through the plays, we discovered the ways to redefine ourselves everyday, making ourselves a little better each passing day. And all that we knew was making us alive was also entertaining the audience and touching some aspect of their emotions. While we were approaching the days of becoming alumni from being the students, what scared us was the conventional standards outside the theatre world. The characters which lived with us through days and nights, some perhaps months, started seeming volatile. That's when we knew we cannot let it all become a past and memory to talk about sipping coffee 20 years later at an alumni meet. Well, we would still be doing that 20 years later but we wanted to live all these 20 years together, living through the stories, exploring the brightest and darkest corners of the theatrical world. All of us wanted to enjoy the one thing that united us with whatever little time we could find via theatre. Our first production was staged on 7th Oct 2018 at our alma-mater, IIT-D and until now we have had 32 shows and 2 film productions at different locations in Delhi, Chandigarh, Mumbai, Bengaluru and even Pittsburgh.

































To be around them, learning and teaching has become an incredibly beautiful part of our souls. As far as funds are concerned, we contribute from our salaries and book auditoriums. Through the digital marketing plays and word of mouth we sell our tickets and whatever comes in goes into the society funds which we further utilize for our next acts. Initially we just want to brush up ourselves and aim to deliver performances that speak for itself. But yes, in the long run we aim to achieve both national and international recognition. We aspire to grow into legendary actors and directors and entertain the audience. We are consistently laying out plans to on-board more members or rather let's say artists from across all platforms of acting, directing, music and writing enthusiasts. As we move forward, we also look forward to spreading our performances not just in Tier 1 cities like Delhi, Mumbai & Bangalore but also wish to touch the audience in cities like Lucknow, Nagpur, Pune & Chandigarh.

We want to create a legacy that inspires others to dream more, learn more, do more and become more, everyday. We look forward to reaching out to more of you and would love to welcome the old wrinkles with mirth and laughter. 








































































































































'Han kahne me utna aakarshan nahin hai jitna na Kahne me hai'


'Saying Yes is not as enchanting as saying No is'. Manav Kaul's 'Chuhal' explores a different dimension of human relationships.

The inception of the idea that we have to do this play undertook at Marine Drive, Mumbai. Since some actors were new, they needed to get into character in the least time possible out of their busy schedule. The dedication and enthusiasm of the team were evident as actors traveled over 80kms by train to reach 'Gol Maidan' to ensure their presence in a 90 min practice session every evening. Practicing for play under street lights in a playground was another challenge to the artistic acumen of the team.

The play was staged in Veda Factory, Mumbai.

Meticulously designed music and light created a mesmerising show which treated the audience with an hour of witty, humorous and reflective experience. Small size of the auditorium was well exploited by the actors to give the audience immersive entertainment. Conversation between Arti's mother and Sudheer's sister Nimmi was adequately pushing the light mood in the play. The character of Waiter and Peon were just enough of 'masala' the play needed. Symbolism in the play was subtle and the audience appreciated how a typical woman's mind was given wings to change the usual discourse of the society. It was a total enriching experience for me and my team, and I am sure that the same holds true for the audience as well.





aid is inspired from a small sequence which is also part of the play, "A Struggling Insect". Each one of us must have witnessed this in our daily lives and our nearby space. Writing the script for this play was emotionally draining, and the process was quite complex. To maintain a relational conflict between mutually exclusive goals of the characters and his inbound environment was challenging. I tried to maintain a balance between the two different perspectives of life. Writing the duologues to explain the motive of the protagonist was the trickiest part of all but we succeeded in this goal.

'Qaid' has different levels of interpretation & a treat to those who can understand some deep philosophical and psychological concerns. What is right? or what is wrong? To portray these sentiments on stage, 'Qaid' highlights how the actor's own life experiences are responsible for his beliefs in creating a free soul out of the material body. Through the characters, I tried to be realistic about their intention, from clothing & shackles to the stage setup. I tried to put specific focus on incorporating visual & aural design elements, staging & blocking and diction of the characters. I tried to engage the audience a couple of times with total silence in the room to help them absorb the meaning of the dialogues & fill the gaps with their own experiences.





EDWARD ALBEE'S THE GOAT OR WHO IS SYLVIA?

Directed By Nikhil Chaudhary





Alchemy Theatre Society's production - The Goat, or Who is Sylvia? is a triple Pulitzer Prize-winner Edward Albee's acclaimed play about a married, middle-aged architect who falls in a love affair. Martin is at the pinnacle of life: he has a loving wife and son, a hugely successful career as an architect, and the commission of a lifetime, but when he embarks upon an improbable and impossible love affair from which there is no return, he must face the dizzying, explosive consequences. Known for works such as Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? Albee's fourhander not only shows a family in crisis but also challenges taboos and moral judgment. It is such an interesting phenomenon to be the director of a play that challenges the heights of taboos in society and perform one of the characters at the same time knowing that the actors are doing what you asked of them in the rehearsal process.

I played a middle-aged architect, Martin, who has taken a turn for the worst at age 40 and started a questionable love affair with livestock. While the storyline focuses on Martin's affair, his wife Stevie, played by Varshiki Jethwani, is the one who truly captured the audience's attention. In dialogues with Martin, it's hard to take your eyes off of her as she floats between comedy and tragedy expertly. Ross, Martin's friend, was as fluent as one can be amid the funny charm Ravinder Singh brings every time on stage while acting. The only regret I'm left with is the guts to put the kissing scene between Martin and his son Billy played brilliantly by Gaurav Singh with an authentic mixture of sarcasm and loneliness, on stage along with bestiality as the central theme of the script. Maybe one day I will be more relentless in my efforts. 'The Goat, or Who Is Sylvia?' can certainly do it for me.



We could feel those cravings that the artists were going through during the lockdown. We tried to figure out how to keep the artists engaged in this stre<mark>ssful situation where everyone is locked up in</mark> their homes and not getting the opportunity to explore their creative skills. The intention behind organizing online events during lockdown wa<mark>s to engage and collaborate with the artists</mark> around the country. We started with the POETRY WEEK and then it was no coming back. After completing 29 successful episodes of poetry week, we organized a Live Instagram event - GUFTUGU. Eminent theatre personalities were invited to share their experiences in the field of theatre and cinema. Post Guftugu, we organized two competitions to engage the artists - LOCKDOWN MONOLOGUE COMPETITION and NATSAMRAT MONOLOGUE COMPETITION. Also, we organized an online acting certification course by the name - RANGMANCH, where we trained few theatre enthusiasts. Besides that, we started a theatre series by the name - ALCHEMY THEATRE AT HOME, where we premiered four officially recorded plays of Alchemy Theatre Society on our YouTube Channel in collaboration with BookmyShow, IITD Alumni Association and IIDonAir. The intention was to make the audience accessible to theatre even at home. In order to provide theatre to the audience at their home, we went one level ahead and produced two Cineplays - A concept not very developed in our country. We produced ALL THE WORLD's A STAGE - A cineplay based on Shakespeare's work which received great appreciation at the International Level by getting shortlisted for few International short film festivals. Another short film produced by Alchemy Theatre Society was TRAPDOOR - a short film based on the time travel concept which got a place in the THEATREFILMTHEATRE Short Film Festival organized by The Theatre Company and received rave reviews on its premiere. And finally, we collaborated with few directors of Alchemy who produced four short films which got premiered on our YouTube channel in Alchemy Theatre Festival 2020. Overall, it was quite a collaborative and inclusive experience for the members of Alchemy.

Online Acting Course

What makes an actor truly great? The actor's job is to bring a scripted character to life. Acting technique is paramount to anyone wanting to be a serious actor. The technique, however, will help you find a character, which in turn informs how you approach the text /script / written word. How do you bring the dialogue alive? How do you know what choices to make? The goal of a trained actor is to become a fully realised three-dimensional character, with a rich backstory.

Alchemy ran its first ever online acting training course in the middle of lockdown in the month of July, where Nikhil and his team of experienced member artists crafted their magic on our students. We created the Lockdown Acting Intensive when we were on the lockdown to help aspiring actors and beginners that were slowly going nuts at indoors.


























ALCHEMY THEATRE AT AT

From Saturday 13 June, a number of productions previously performed in theatre auditoriums across India as a part of Alchemy Theatre Productions have been made available to watch via Alchemy Theatre's YouTube Channel. Theatre is all about experiencing a story together. At a time when many theatre fans around the country aren't able to visit live venues or local theatres, we decided to introduce Alchemy Theatre at Home via online platforms. Initially, Alchemy Theatre Society collaborated with BookMyShow to bring back 'Qaid', an original written composition at doorstep via BookMyShow online streaming on 13th June 2020. Later moved on partnerships with IIT Delhi OnAir and IIT Delhi Alumni Association to deliver productions like 'Natyachalak', 'Final Solutions' and 'The Front Page'. Each production was free and screened live every weekend at 9:00 PM, and was available on demand for seven days.











A thriller drama written by Saurabh Mishra centered around an arrogant serial killer. QAID is the chilling story of a man who believes himself as a mediator between the human soul and God. Screened at BookMyShow on 13th June 2020

Directed by Satyam Gangwar, this play has a powerful contemporary resonance as it addresses an issue of utmost concern to our society, i.e. the issue of communalism. It presents different shades of the communalist attitude prevalent among Hindus & Muslims in its attempt to underline the stereotypes and clichés influencing the collective sensibility of one community against another. A high class drama around the backend story of a theatre artist and Bollywood superstar. It is richly layered to offer several universal themes. 

I spent about a week developing the script with Namit and Vaibhav, then started working with a storyboard to develop visual images as a blueprint to work from. We decided to shoot everything through a DSLR but few shots stick to smart phones in absence of a real shooting camera. Satyam Gangwar was the main lead, playing the character of a Mathematics scholar.

Building with him remotely around shoot was an interesting task. There were two other actors (Namit and Vaibhav) involved, playing out the character of Ashwathama and Hamlet magically, merely in a single day. I feel a great deal of gratitude to them for hanging out despite tough situations around Covid-19. Everyone was fantastic and did an impeccable job. A big thanks to Saurabh Mishra, Haresh Chaudhary, Pranjalya Singh, Vaibhav Gupta, Satyam Gangwar, Jaishri Bahori and Namit Mishra for creating such a beautiful concept integrating 'Theatre & Cinema'.

In terms of timeline, shooting remotely and multiple uncertain lockdowns did pose a real challenge to complete the film within the given time frame. We completed the film in less than a month and submitted it to the film festival by the end of the first week of August'20.






